- Must demonstrate need for financial assistance.
- Must demonstrate involvement in the community and/or work experience.
- Must attend school in the following counties: Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, Inland Empire, and Ventura County.

- o Must be a U.S. citizen, permanent legal resident, DACA or eligible non-citizen (as defined by FASFA).
- o Complete FAFSA or state based financial aid application (if applicable).
